



It is important that the presenting authors read these guidelines carefully to ensure that their presentations meet the required standards and effectively communicate their work.

POSTER PRESENTATION GUIDELINES

GENERAL INFORMATION

The date and time of poster presentations will be specified in the Conference Scientific Programme, which will be available on the conference website in due time.

Printed posters will be displayed in dedicated areas of the conference venue:

- Posters scheduled for presentation on Monday, 1st June should be mounted in the morning and removed at 6 pm on the same day.
- Posters scheduled for presentations on Tuesday, 2nd June should be mounted in the morning and removed at the end of the conference.

PRINTING

Presenting authors should bring to the conference a printed version in the conventional style (size A0 = 84.1 x 118.9 cm, orientation portrait), including graphs, photos, diagrams and a small amount of text. A non-mandatory template can be found at this [link](#).

They can also bring as many copies as they like of a printed A4 version of their posters for distribution.

PRESENTATION

The dedicated Poster Sessions are foreseen in the Conference Programme. Conference participants will walk around the poster area, and the presenting authors will be able to present their work.

STUDENTS AWARDS

The competition is open to BSc, MSc and PhD students enrolled in any food study programme. All abstracts that have a student as the "presenting author" will be automatically included in the competition. Be aware that students presenting posters are required to be next to their poster during the poster session, in accordance with the evaluation criteria.

Important note: All students are required to submit their poster for pre-evaluation via [this link](#) by 28/05/2026. Please name your file using the format "**AbstractNumber_Last_Firstname.pdf**" (for example, "2526 Silva_Manuel.pdf") so that organisers can easily identify each presentation. Generic file names such as "Conference.pdf" or "Faro.pdf" should not be used.
